<u>Saturday 3rd December: 'United for Warm Homes'</u> national day of action on fuel poverty. One suggestion is we organise a photo opportunity to raise publicity – need to think of who to involve and where to do it. https://unitedforwarmhomes.uk/warm-winter-day-action-fuel-poverty

The day of action will contribute to a flurry of activity on fuel poverty at the start of December, and will immediately follow Fuel Poverty Awareness Day on 2 December. The Day of Action will see people come together as part of a wider national movement for warm homes and demand solutions to the energy and cost-of-living crises.

At our October meeting we were told that the aim of 'United for Warm Homes' https://unitedforwarmhomes.uk/ is to build a movement over three years to pursue three key aims:

- 1/. Urgent additional financial support to keep people warm.
- 2/. A nationwide insulation programme.
- 3/. Permanent fixes to our failed energy system. Powering our homes with cheap and clean renewables

This will be supported by FoE but branded 'United for Warm Homes' – aiming to include individuals and groups concerned with welfare and poverty and politics as well as environmental groups.

Cumbrian Coal Mine:

Back in March we delivered a letter to Alok Sharma MP calling on him to stop the government approving a new mine for 'coking coal' in Cumbria.

We had expected the decision to be announced in summer but then it was put back to 8th November 2022 and now until after COP27 – on or before 8th December.

Government defeated on Climate Strategy:

Back in July FoE and others persuaded the High Court to rule that the government's Net Zero Strategy breaches the Climate Change Act.
