# Transport and Air Quality in Reading - What's Going On?

It says the Council had conducted "initial business case work to investigate the environmental and economic case for developing a Clean Air Zone." Section 4.3 says: " ... The environmental case for a CAZ identified that the expected improvements in air quality would be marginal and that only one (of 13) receptors that currently exceeds the Air Quality Standard would improve sufficiently so that it no longer exceeded the acceptable standard, with 12 still exceeding the AQS. The report also noted that due to the current CAZ minimum standard, between 95% and 100% of vehicles would be compliant by 2026/27."

This is amazing because even without Covid we had understood that Reading expected to be fully legally compliant on Nitrogen Dioxide levels by the end of 2021, as predicted following modelling as a result of which it received £1.5 million government funding in 2019 to reduce emissions from Reading Buses:

The Council has not responded to requests to:

- provide data on the 13 receptors that exceed air quality standards and explain the results
- provide details of the study that concluded that a CAZ would only bring one receptor into compliance
- explain why a stricter CAZ strategy (that could bring the whole area into compliance) was not investigated

While Nitrogen Dioxide is a serious pollutant even when below the legal limit the likely concentrations of microparticles – PM2.5 – is of even greater concern. The UK National Air Quality Objective for annual average PM2.5 is 25 ug/m^3 but the WHO guide is 10 ug/m^3 and WHO are explicit that this is not a safe threshold. RBC estimated in 2018 that it was 16.1 ug/m^3 on Caversham Road.

# Reading Golf Course – plans for at least 257 houses in Caversham:

The new planning application (Number 210018) to Reading Borough Council was rejected in July on grounds of loss of open space and various issues around layout, trees and ecology. There were significant last-minute improvements to the proposals for renewable energy although even higher standards could have been proposed. Keep Emmer Green <a href="https://keepemmergreen.com/">https://keepemmergreen.com/</a> are reviewing the Planning Officer's report to Committee – presumably to see if the developers could appeal and to try to anticipate any changes they might make that would make it impossible to refuse. KEG are also proposing that the land be used for an Arboretum.

# Incinerator proposed for Burghfield:

During the summer of 2020 local company J Mould (<a href="https://www.jmouldreading.co.uk/">https://www.jmouldreading.co.uk/</a>) submitted planning application number 20/02029/COMIND to build an "Energy from Waste" (EfW) incinerator located on the local authority boundaries of Reading Borough Council and West Berkshire Council in Burghfield (as discussed in our May newsletter). We have objected. There is no news as to when this will go to their planning committee.

Good government is committed to including international aviation (and shipping) emissions in the UK's Sixth Carbon Budget and are consulting on an earlier target for UK domestic aviation to reach net zero by 2040. But one of the options considered requires offsetting 21 M tonnes of carbon in 2050!
