

#### **Earley Green Fair:**

Thanks to Paolo, Barbara, Chris, Anne and John for a good day at this event on 6<sup>th</sup> August. We talked to a lot of people, including Wokingham and Earley Councillors, often about heat pumps.

#### **Burghfield Incinerator:**

Thanks to Graham for speaking out against the Burghfield Incinerator at West Berkshire Planning Committee. Sadly the committee did not see it our way but they heard our position and Graham was quoted in the Newbury Weekly News <a href="https://www.newburytoday.co.uk/news/plans-for-huge-waste-burning-plant-are-rubber-stamped-9270944/">https://www.newburytoday.co.uk/news/plans-for-huge-waste-burning-plant-are-rubber-stamped-9270944/</a> and Reading Chronicle.

Developer J Mould is to spend £260 million on a plant to burn stuff without the carbon capture and storage recommended by the Climate Change Committee. 39 heavy lorries will bring material to the plant every day. 50m tall chimneys will be visible from the M4.

#### **Bloomfield Hatch Solar Farm:**

Last week West Berkshire Council also gave itself planning permission for 30 years for a Solar Farm (76.2 Acres, 26.65 MWp, claimed to be sufficient to supply electricity for 7,828 average homes) on agricultural land between Grazeley Green and Mortimer that it owns. The agricultural land is 'Grade 3b' and the area is about 0.045% of the West Berkshire land area.

There was a lot of discussion and a Councillor suggested that a new Conservative Prime Minister might change planning laws to prevent such developments in the future. One also commented that if the land had been higher grade agricultural land the Officer's recommendation might well have been to reject the application.

#### Warm This Winter:

FoE has united with other leading environmental and anti-poverty organisations to launch a new campaign: "Warm This Winter" to demand action that meets the scale of the energy crisis.

#### Transport for the South East - Consultation closes 12th September - act now!

Transport for the South East (TfSE) (the non-statutory grouping of local authorities and others) has launched a consultation <a href="https://transportforthesoutheast.org.uk/our-work/developing-our-strategic-investment-plan/">https://transportforthesoutheast.org.uk/our-work/developing-our-strategic-investment-plan/</a> on its draft Strategic Investment Plan. Consultation ends on12th September so please respond soon - see below – it can be as easy or as difficult as you like ... but you have to register with TAN or TfSE.

It is the investment plan for the previously defined strategy to 2050. Forecasts 2050 reductions in carbon emissions but without 2030 targets. Proposes to spend around £1.5 billion per year. Proposes heavy spend on rail improvements but mostly not until late in the period to 2050. Not enough on active travel and carbon reduction in next decade.

Transport Action Network (TAN) has an on-line template response <u>Help stop the south east being swamped with even more traffic (actionnetwork.org)</u> which you can adapt. They say "Unfortunately, **TfSE's plan contains over 90 road schemes**, over 50 of which it wants built by 2030. In contrast, while the plan contains ambitious ideas for public transport, these are far less developed, have no delivery plan and risk never being built."

#### Bill of Rights (or the 'Rights Removal Bill' as it's been dubbed by campaigners) and the Public Order Bill:

These contain threats to the space in which we campaign for environmental and social justice - restrictions on our right to protest. FoE would like us to meet with our Conservative MPs before 12<sup>th</sup> September if possible, but failing that FoE have put together this briefing about the two bills (which includes a template email for you to get in touch with your MP) and this shorter summary version of the briefing if you're short on time.

#### 4,500 Homes and maybe a new M4 Junction for Hall Farm?

The Conservative group that had put greenfield development at Hall Farm on UoR land south of Earley into their draft Local Plan for Wokingham Borough lost power to a Liberal Democrat led partnership (including Independent and Labour Councillors) at the June elections.

New leader Clive Jones is having meetings with local MPs to try to get the government to agree to reduce the number of new homes Wokingham is required to build. Objectors to the proposed development have so far failed to get him to commit to drop Hall Farm from the next draft plan.

Back in March we delivered a letter to Alok Sharma MP calling on him to stop the government approving a new mine for 'coking coal' in Cumbria. We had expected the decision to be announced very soon but now it has been put back to 8<sup>th</sup> November 2022. #### **Government defeated on Climate Strategy:**

Back in July FoE and others persuaded the High Court to rule that the government's Net Zero Strategy breaches the Climate Change Act. Govt's climate strategy deemed "unlawful" in historic ruling | Friends of the Earth

#### Sizewell C:

Boris Johnson has just agreed the next phase of funding for Sizewell C nuclear power station. <a href="https://www.theguardian.com/environment/2022/aug/31/who-will-fund-sizewell-c-nuclear-plant-when-will-it-be-built-explainer">https://www.theguardian.com/environment/2022/aug/31/who-will-fund-sizewell-c-nuclear-plant-when-will-it-be-built-explainer</a>

The University of Greenwich forecasts predict it will take 15 years to build Sizewell C, or 17 years under its gloomiest forecast, and cost £43.8bn compared to official estimates of £20bn to £30bn. So it won't start generating until the late 2030s but because of the 'regulated asset base' funding mechanism it will add between £1 and £2.12 to people's monthly bills from the start of the project.

FoE's 2017 policy position is to oppose new nuclear power stations. <u>Nuclear energy: our position | Policy and insight</u> (friendsoftheearth.uk)
